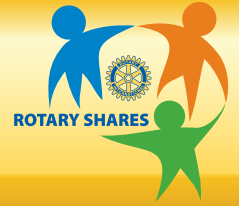

## R.I. Director's Comments

The Southern California Fires have been receiving extensive media coverage. Some of the early fires began last Saturday, October 20th, as powerful Santa Anna winds blew into the Southern California area (with gusts reported up to 80-100 mph). Initially fire coverage centered on Malibu, CA (in D5280) – and given the prominence of this high profile community, the fire and damage immediately drew international attention.

Contrary to most natural disasters (e.g., earthquakes, tornados, hurricanes, etc.) that have a relatively limited timeframe during which they do their primary damage – wildfires, such as those currently being experienced in Southern California, can take a far longer period until they are eventually controlled. Therefore, more time elapses before the full scale of the tragedies can be assessed. This is the period our seven Southern California Rotary districts are in at the moment.

I have received status reports from each District – and believe we would all agree the two hardest hit are District 5330 (which includes Lake Arrowhead, Big Bear, Riverside and the Coachella Valley area) and District 5320 (mainly in San Diego County). Please keep your fellow Rotarians in your thoughts.

### (Provisional) Rotaract Club of Washington County

In June 2007, the board of the Rotary Club of Beaverton decided to sponsor a Rotaract Club. This was with a view of spreading Rotary's values and objectives among our community leaders between the ages of 18 and 30. As a result, a group of young individuals has been meeting in Beaverton, planning the formation of the Rotaract Club of Washington County and discussing opportunities to serve the community.

The group now consists of 16 active members and has contributed to the community by participating in the American Lung Association's walk event in Portland, and helping to brighten Halloween for residents of a retirement village. It is our plan to add to District Governor Dave's paperwork very soon by having him sign off on the charter of this new club.
