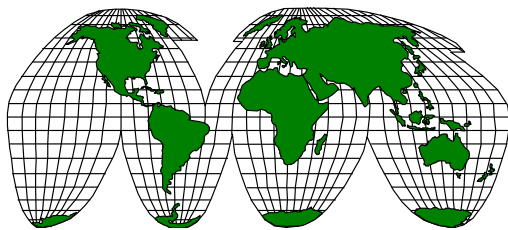


# MONMOUTH - INDEPENDENCE ROTARY CLUB MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION

Rotary membership can be extended to any person, regardless of race, religion, sex, or national origin. Members should be a proprietor, partner, or manager of a worthy



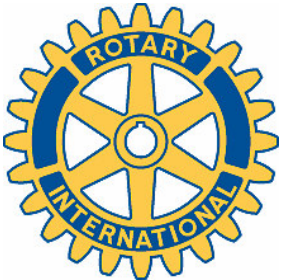
business or profession; or hold an important executive position in such a business or profession located within our local
